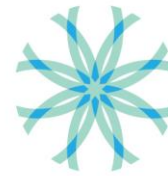


WE NEED YOU TO KEEP CART-WHEEL IN MOTION

CART-WHEEL.org is the Center for Analysis of Rare Tumors but also means...

Collect information from as many people as possible
Analyse the information about rare tumors
Research new discoveries for rare tumors
Treat rare tumors more effectively

The CART-WHEEL rare tumor database exists to address some of the barriers facing effective research into rare types of tumors, rare subtypes of common cancers and inherited rare tumor predisposition.

The website (www.cart-wheel.org) is designed to collect information from people such as you, who have **a rare tumor OR an inherited rare tumor predisposition.**

WE NEED YOU to keep CART-WHEEL in motion.

Using the CART-WHEEL website, people from all over the world are able to register and fill out a privacy-protected, internet-based questionnaire which covers information ranging from your type of tumor or inherited rare tumor predisposition and treatment received, to aspects of your family history.

You have control over your personal details by providing consent for different uses of your entered data. This ranges from storage of your de-identified data to being contacted for participation in a relevant clinical trial.

Get involved

Even if you think your tumor or inherited tumor predisposition, for example due to a faulty gene, is not rare, we would still appreciate you completing the questionnaire to help us better understand your tumor type.

If you are interested, please visit the CART-WHEEL website (www.cart-wheel.org), fill in the consent form and enter your information. The questionnaire, developed by consumers to be user friendly will ask questions about your medical history and disease.
